



THE LODGE AT LANE'S POND

All Mayflower Outfitters hunts are based from our private lodge at Lane's Pond. The lodge was built by our family and reflects how we hunt and how we host.

Guest accommodations are housed in separate lodges constructed from local wood, each with private entrances overlooking the pond. The main lodge includes a dining room, sitting area, and fireplace. Guides are housed separately.

MAYFLOWER MEAT CUTTING FACILITY

Mayflower Outfitters works closely with the Mayflower Meat Cutting Facility, located in the town of Roddickton, next to the Mayflower Inn.

This local, inspected facility handles the processing of harvested animals with care and professionalism. Meat is cut, vacuum packed, and blast frozen, ensuring quality preservation and proper handling.

Having a trusted meat cutting operation nearby provides confidence that harvested animals are processed promptly and prepared to a high standard.

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GETTING HERE

Experience Newfoundland along the way. Our location, and the island itself, ensure that the journey to Mayflower Lodge is part of the adventure. Whether flying or driving, guests experience Newfoundland's rugged coastlines, open landscapes, and small coastal communities along the way.

FLYING

The most common and convenient airport is **Deer Lake Airport**, approximately a **4.5-hour drive** to Mayflower Lodge. Flights to Deer Lake are available through **Air Canada**.

Mayflower Outfitters can arrange **guest pickup and return** at an additional cost. Many hunters choose to rent a vehicle, allowing flexibility to explore Newfoundland at their own pace. Vehicle rentals should be reserved in advance.

The closest regional airport is **St. Anthony Airport**, located approximately **one hour** from Roddickton, with service provided by **Provincial Airlines**.

DRIVING & FERRY ACCESS

Travel by road is available via the **Viking Trail (Route 430)**. Ferry service is available from **North Sydney, Nova Scotia** to **Port aux Basques, Newfoundland** through **Marine Atlantic**.

The island can also be accessed via the **Trans-Labrador Highway** using **Labrador Marine**, connecting to the ferry at **St. Barbe**, followed by approximately a **1.5-hour drive** to Mayflower Lodge.

NEWFOUNDLAND MOOSE HUNTS

Our Newfoundland moose hunts take place in a region known for a healthy, well-managed moose population, providing consistently high success rates and outstanding hunting opportunities.

Each hunt is a six-day guided experience. Hunters arrive on Sunday, with hunting beginning on Monday and continuing through Saturday. Every hunter is paired with their own personal guide, allowing for focused hunting and individual attention throughout the week.

HUNT SEASONS

Archery Only: One week only, beginning the last Saturday of August.

Rifle Season: Mid-September through the end of October.

Each guide generally operates within their own established hunting area. Hunting involves glassing, calling, and spot-and-stalk techniques. Walking is part of the experience, adjusted to the hunter's physical condition.

AFTER THE HARVEST

Animals are retrieved, skinned, caped, and prepared for delivery to the meat cutting facility.

SPRING BLACK BEAR HUNTS

Spring black bear hunting on Newfoundland's Great Northern Peninsula offers a unique combination of exceptional bears, low hunting pressure, and excellent spring conditions.

Some of the largest black bears ever recorded have come from Newfoundland. Biologists continue to study why bears here grow to such impressive size.

Some believe Newfoundland's black bears represent a magnum-sized subspecies, while others suggest ideal habitat, abundant food sources, and historically light hunting pressure allow bears to reach their full genetic potential.

In either case, the result is the same — an outstanding opportunity to take a true trophy black bear.

Hunting is conducted over established baited areas using tree stands. Trail cameras are used to monitor bear activity and evaluate size before hunts.

Seasonal experiences may include iceberg viewing, trout fishing, Atlantic salmon fishing, and local seafood and lobster season.



TROPHY WOODLAND CARIBOU HUNTS

Mayflower Outfitters operates in the northernmost woodland caribou management area in Newfoundland and Labrador, offering one of the most exclusive caribou hunting opportunities remaining in North America.

Hunting is conducted through spot-and-stalk methods in open country during the rut. Guides assist in selecting mature trophy stags based on antler mass, symmetry, and character.

RECOGNITION

During the 32nd Edition of the Boone and Crockett Records, caribou taken by Mayflower Outfitters hunters placed First and Second overall.
